Urgently need to see a GP out of surgery hours?</p>	<p>Contact 111 if you are ill and have any questions about your health. 111 can also help you find health services in your area. Medical assistance is still available if your surgery is closed. Call 111 to be directed to the GP Out-of-Hours Service.</p>	
<p>Accident & Emergency (A&E) or 999</p>	<p>Choking, chest pain, suspected stroke, blacking out, bleeding you can't stop, struggling to breathe, sprains and other injuries.</p>	<p>Visit A&E at Frimley Park Hospital, Portsmouth Road, Frimley GU16 7UJ (Tel: 01276 604 604) or call 999 for an ambulance.</p>
